Immunization Requirements! (7th & 12th Graders)



The Iowa Department of Public Health made changes to the Iowa Immunization Law beginning with the 2018-2019 school year. This change requires that all students entering 7th grade have both a Meningococcal Immunization and a TDAP (Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis/Whooping Cough) booster before school starts this fall. All students entering 12th grade must have a Meningococcal Immunization before school starts this fall.

Pertussis (whooping cough) is a very contagious disease that causes violent coughing fits that make it hard to breathe. Meningococcal disease is a life threatening illness that is caused by bacteria that infects the brain, blood, and spinal cord. It easily spreads in crowded settings.



The ASAP (Allies for Substance Abuse Prevention) Coalition wants to help make sure you are informed about various apps your kids may be using online so you can help keep them safe.

Below is a diagram explaining each of the apps and why your children may be vulnerable.

Prom and Graduation Pointers

Many teens are making plans for senior prom and graduation. While these are fun and safe events for most, it is also a high-risk time for underage drinking and other drug use. Parents and other adults can help keep teens safe by being informed and prepared.

Tips for parents: Surviving prom and graduation season

ASK FOR DETAILS

Find out where your teen's going, who he will be with, who's driving, and what time he will be at each location.

GIVE A CURFEW

Avoid the temptation to let curfew go on special occasions. You set curfew (and other rules) for a reason.



REVIEW THE BASICS

Remind your teens to wear seat belts, avoid situations that put them in danger (like riding with someone who's been drinking), and discuss the consequences of breaking your rules. Again, make no exceptions for prom night.

LOCK YOUR LIQUOR CABINET

If you're worried your teens or their friends will drink, try to curb the problem by locking up your own supply. The same goes for prescription medications.

TALK TO THE OTHER PARENTS

Make sure you and the other adults are all on the same page. Try to talk other parents out of buying alcohol, which includes limousines stocked with alcohol, supplying drugs and/or hotel rooms for prom-goers.

GIVE HER A WAY OUT

If your teen does get into a situation she's not comfortable with, you want her to be able to call or text you without worrying about being punished.



TRUST HIM

If he tells you where he's going, who he's with and what time he'll be home, trust him. You've raised him to be responsible, so hug him tight and tell him to keep making good choices.

Fentanyl and What You Need to Know to Keep Your Children Safe

Fatal drug overdoses have surged in recent years, driven by the explosion of a synthetic opioid known as fentanyl. What makes fentanyl so dangerous is its potency — and the fact that many of its victims have no idea they're even taking fentanyl.

A lot of it is accidental, young people believe they're misusing medications like oxycodone or pain relievers, or anxiety medications like Xanax, but in fact they're counterfeit pills tainted by fentanyl.

To be clear, fentanyl has legitimate medical uses. Licensed medical professionals use it to treat patients with severe pain after surgeries. But fentanyl is increasingly flooding the illegal drug market, often in the form of counterfeit pills masquerading as common prescription opioids. And, as the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration notes, it **only takes one pill** to produce deadly consequences.
